## **Minutes of the Meeting regarding Phasing out of Dental Amalgam and Mercury BP Instruments and Thermometer**

A meeting regarding phasing out of Dental Amalgam and Mercury BP Instruments and Thermometer, was held with various stake holders of Delhi-NCR Region, under the chairmanship of Dr. N.S. Dharmshaktu, Addl. Director General, on 25<sup>th</sup> February, 2016 at 3 p.m. in R.No.439B(A-wing), New Delhi (List of participants is enclosed). The Chairman introduced the objective of the meeting to the participants stating that the Government of India has already signed Minimata Convention on Mercury and resolution has been taken for phasing out of mercury BP Instruments, Thermometer and Dental Amalgam by 2020. The Government of India's strategy for phasing out and guidelines has been given to all the Central Government Hospitals and the States/UTs have also been requested for phasing out of these products by 2020, which has been included in the IPHS for district hospitals.

The Secretary General of Indian Medical Association (IMA) handed over to the Chairman the IMA phasing out policy of mercury BP instruments and thermometer by 27<sup>th</sup> December 2016, and he informed that an appeal is also being sent to all the IMA members. Dr. RML Hospital, Medanta Hospital, and DGAFMS, Max Hospital, informed that Mercury Amalgam, including BP instruments and thermometer have been completely phased out by them. The DGFMS has issued instructions to all the Medical and Procurement Agencies under Armed Forces Medical Services to stop procuring mercury based medical devices w.e.f. 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2016 and phase out existing such devices in consonance with national policy. According to the information collected through Regional Directors of HFW, six States have phased out mercury thermometer and sphygmomanometer (Delhi, Chandigarh, Goa, Haryana, Punjab and Madhya Pradesh) and in other States, it is at various phases. The Advisor- Health, Railways, stated that Railways has phased out about 70% and gradually they will be able to do it before the target date by 2020.

Alternate to Dental Amalgam are available but they require special technique and training. Dr. Ajay Logani, Representative from CDER (Centre for Dental Education and Research), AIIMS, mentioned that it is almost phased out from AIIMS. Dr. Mahesh Verma, Director Principal, Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences, mentioned that use of mercury has been reduced to great extent, however, it is still preferred in few special categories by patients and in such cases it is used in capsulated form and with adequate precautions, the risk is minimum. In view of that, he mentioned that the import of Amalgam, should be gradually reduced from current year.

In view of above discussion, the recommendations given are as under:-

- i) Import of Mercury should not be completely stopped from this year, however, should be reduced gradually, so as to stop it completely by 2020.
- ii) Many leading Hospitals have already stopped using mercury equipments and dental amalgam for the last 4-5 years and the alternatives are available and it would be possible to phase out the mercury by 2020, so far BP Instruments and Thermometers and amalgam are concerned.
- iii) The public awareness should be conducted to make people aware of the hazards of using of available mercury thermometer and BP instruments as well as dental filling instruments and also make them aware of availability of alternate materials/equipments and their use.
- iv) The use of alternative materials should be promoted by training of dental professionals in using mercury free alternatives.
- v) The policy of IMA is very encouraging and it is possible to reach to general practitioner in every corner of the country through IMA. The appeal being issued by the Secretary General, IMA to its members is highly appreciable.
- vi) The research to further improve the available alternative of dental amalgam should be encouraged.
- vii) Efforts should be made to prevent dental carries under National Oral Health Programmes and School Health Programmes and through various educational



measures.

- viii) The representatives of DCG(I) was not present. The members suggested that DCG(I) should take all the efforts necessary to phase out mercury containing cosmetics with more than 1 ppm including skin lightening creams and soap by 2020 and the antiseptic ointments containing mercury should also be phased out by 2020.
- ix) The Medical Store Organisation (MSO) whenever doing any rate contract, should not include mercury containing antiseptic.
- x) The MCI should update its standard list of equipments by replacing mercury containing thermometer and BP apparatus by available alternatives.
- xi) The AYUSH Directorate should take a policy decision for phasing out of mercury containing drugs by 2020.
- xii) The Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change should increase the hazardous products treatment and disposal agencies and should also develop some incentive scheme for accepting the returned equipments. As currently, they are providing services only on charging basis.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
