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



The working hours are from 08 a.m. to 10 p.m. in 02 shifts. Total number of books are 5865. Total number of journals subscribed are 58 Indian and 30 Foreign. Internet and medlar facilities are available. The number of computer terminals available in the library are 37. The number of journals with back numbers 42. The total number of staff working in the library are 08. The total budget allocation for buying books Rs. 9113301/- and for journals Rs. 3509476 /-

- Total area of library is 1707.92 sq.mt. as against the requirement of 1600 sq.mt.
- Seating capacity available is for 288 students as against the requirement of 200 (100 for self reading and 100 inside the library).
- Books available are 5865 against the requirement of 5600,
- 58 Indian journals are available as against the minimum requirement of 56 and 30 foreign journals are available as against a minimum requirement of 20, which is adequate.

Central photography cum audio-visual units: Available.

Health Centres: (i) 3 P.H.C.s: P.H.C.s Kalomajra (02kms.), Harpalpur (22 kms), Gajjukhera (15 kms) away from the college, are utilized by the college, out of which Gajjukhera has been developed as R.H.T.C. which was visited by the inspection team. It is entirely under the administrative and financial control of the Principal of Gian Sagar Medical College & Hospital and its facilities are used for teaching purposes. The P.S.M. department organizes teaching programmes and field visits. Other clinical departments like Medicine, Paediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynecology participate in the outreach teaching programmes and medical care. The senior faculty from the department is posted in rotation. L.M.O. is available. Students and interns are posted in batches of 20-25 Separate blocks for accommodating 24 boys & 24 girls is available in the hostel. Messing facilities is available. Lecture hall cum seminar room is available with capacity of 50 seats. Audiovisual aids have been provided. 08 beds have been provided. Antenatal and immunization services are provided at the center and in the field and are adequate. The labour room has 02 beds and 01 delivery table. All the vaccines provided under UIP are available. Facilities for basic investigation are available. Family welfare activities are

regularly carried out. Fortnightly field visits are carried out under the supervision of the Medical Officer. Activities under the national programmes are also carried out.

(iii) U.H.C.: The college owns its Urban Health Centre located at Rajpura a distance of 08 km. from the college. It is under financial and administrative control of Principal of Gian Sagar Medical College & Hospital. A population of 1,54,000 is covered under study area. The P.S.M. department organizes teaching programmes and field visits. lecturer cum medical officer having M.D.{P.S.M.} is posted. One lady medical officer is also posted. Students are posted in batches of 20-25. 02 emergency beds have been provided. The outpatient attendance is 30-40 per day. Delivery services are not available as centre is close to medical college & hospital. Immunization services, antenatal care & MCH services including family welfare activities are regularly carried out e.g Antenatal Care, Postnatal Care, Contraceptive advice & distribution, immunization services & nutrition education to the mother & children are provided by organizing weekly clinics. Facilities for diagnostic investigations and minor Surgery are also available. Duty rosters and records of various activities and investigations are maintained properly. Sign boards and display boards of various rooms are properly displayed.




Workshop: The central workshop is available in the department for maintenance and repair of furniture. The staff and facilities are adequate.

Teaching & Other facilities:

- a) In O.P.D. OPD runs daily between 9 am and 4 pm with lunch break of 1:30 pm to 2:00 pm except Sundays. There is registration counter separate for male and female patients and waiting area is available near these counters. Each speciality is provided with one computerized registration counter and 4-5 rooms for examination of patients and accommodation for the doctors. Teaching facilities like patient couch, stools, x-ray, view box, examination tray, etc. are provided in each room. Each speciality is also provided teaching area with capacity of 20 students. There is a separate injection room for male and female, dressing room, plaster room, plaster cutting room, E.C.G. room, central clinical laboratory, audiometry room (soundproof & Air-conditioned), immunization room, family welfare clinic, dark room refraction room, minor O.T..
- b) In Wards: Most wards are provided duty doctor room, nurse duty room, nursing station, pantry, examination / procedure room, teaching area. Total 19 clinical demonstration areas with a capacity of 20-25 have been provided in the wards. There is a seminar hall in the major departments. All these areas have been provided with audiovisual aids and other teaching facilities. Teaching facilities are adequate.

- 809 OPD attendance is available against the requirement of 800 at this stage, which is adequate.
- 83% bed occupancy is available against the requirement of 80% at this stage, which is adequate.
- Clinical material is adequate in terms of quality and quantity.

Registration and Medical Record Section: There is a separate registration counter for O.P.D. cases in O.P.D. It is computerized. There are 06 clerks. Indoor registration counter is in casualty. It is computerized, and cross linked with outdoor registration numbers and Medical Record Section.

There is a medical record department. It is computerized. It has adequate staff. ICD X Classification of diseases is followed for indexing. Follow up service is available.

Central Casualty Service: Casualty works round the clock and managed by 06 doctors and 11 nurses. Specialists are available on call. The casualty services for Obstetrics & Gynaecology are located in a separate block where labour room also is located.

Total 32 beds are available in casualty area. Central oxygen supply, central suction, defibrillator, pulse oximeter, ambu bag, disaster trolley crash cots etc. are available. Casualty OT is used for minor surgery. Another emergency theatre is fully equipped with anaesthesia, resuscitation and surgical equipment and is located next to the casualty. Radiology department and clinical laboratory are next to casualty.

In casualty emergency cases are admitted, if required emergency treatment is given and transferred to concerned department for further treatment.

Remarks:

- 32 beds are available as against the requirement of 20.

Clinical Laboratories: Central clinical laboratory caters to the out-patient as well as in patients. It is under the control of respective head of the Department and has Pathology, Microbiology and Biochemistry sections; each section is supervised by the concerned department. Microbiological investigations like culture sensitivity, serology etc. are carried out in the department while those like smear etc. are carried out in the central laboratory. Each section is having required modern equipment. Technical staff is available.

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Operation theatre unit: There are 10 operation theatres having total 10 tables. They are air conditioned. Each O.T. is having central oxygen & nitrous oxide supply and central suction. The facilities for preanaesthetic and post anaesthetic care are available. Radiological facilities: 05 static units - (2 of 300 mA, 2 of 500 mA, 1 of 800 mA) are available. 05 mobile units (05 of 100 mA) are also available. In addition, Ultrasound 01, Color Doppler 03 and CT Scan 01 are also available. 01 ultrasound is given to Obstetrics & Gynaecology department. Facilities for special investigations are available. Protective measures as per BARC specification are provided. Facilities and workload are adequate.

- 05 static unit are available as against the requirement of 5 static units of 2x300mA, 2x500mA & 1x800mA. with IITV, Fluoroscopy system.
- 05 mobile X-ray unit are available as against the requirement of 5 mobile units of 2x30mA & 2x60mA each..
- 01 ultrasound machines are available as against the requirement of 03.
- 01 Number of CT Scan against the requirement of 1 Unit available/not available which are adequate.

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Pharmacy: The staff consists of 14. On an average daily patients (600 outdoor and 280 indoor) are given drugs.

Central sterilization department: It works round the clock in 02 shifts. There are 04 Horizontal autoclaves, 01 bowl sterilizer, 01 Glove inspection machine and 01 instrument washing machine in CSSD. Sterilization facilities are also available in operation theatre block. 25 racks, 200 trays and 50 mixers are also available. The receiving and distribution points are separate. CSSD facilities and staff are available.

Intercom facilities : EPABX of 10 incoming and 130 extension lines is provided. All the wards, O.T., O.I.D., offices and departments are connected.

Central laundry: It is having 04 bulk washing machines, 02 hydro extractors, 03 rolley steam press, 2 Drier and 03 pressing machine. Daily volume of work is 240-250 kg. The staff consists of 01 supervisor, 05 dhobis and 04 packers.

Kitchen: It is Gas type. Vegetarian food is supplied free of charge to 300-350 patients daily. There is provision to supply special diet as recommended by Physician. Per capita expenditure per day is Rs.70/-. Services of dietician are available.

Canteen: 02 canteens are in the hospital for staff, students and patients' relatives. It is partially subsidized.

Incinerator: Incinerators is not available

College has entered into an agreement with M/s Rainbow Environment for disposal of Bio Medical Waste as per the guidelines of Punjab State Pollution Control Board.

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MEDICAL COLLEGE

Anatomy Department:

Teaching staff consists of 02 Professors, 01 Associate Professors, 04 Assistant Professors and 04 Tutors. Offices are available for teaching and non-teaching staff.

Teaching Facilities : Lecture theaters are used from common pool. They are provided with adequate A.V. Aids. There are 03 demonstration rooms each having 60 seats. Dissection hall has 120 seats, 15 big and 05 small dissection tables. It has adequate exhaust, light, water supply and drainage facilities. There are 03 storage tanks. There are 31 cadavers. There is a cooling cabinet for 09 bodies. There is embalming room with required equipment. There is Band saw. Sufficient student lockers are provided. Museum is divided in 02 parts. It has 70 mounted specimens, 112 models and 35 bone sets. MRI, CT and X-rays are also displayed. 04 catalogues are available. The catalogues are kept near the specimens.

Teaching Programme: consists of lectures, demonstration, clinical postings and seminar. It is organized as per Council recommendations.

Physiology Department:

Teaching staff consists of 03 Professor, Nil Associate Professor, 06 Assistant Professors, 04 Tutors, and nil Assistant Professor in Biophysics. Offices are available for teaching and non-teaching staff.

Teaching facilities : Lecture theaters are used from common pool. They are provided with adequate A.V. Aids. There are 01 demonstration rooms, each having 60 seats.

Teaching Programme: consists of lectures, demonstration, clinical postings and seminar. It is organized as per Council recommendations.

Biochemistry Department:

Teaching staff consists of 02 Professors, 01 Associate Professor, 04 Assistant Professors, and 04 Tutors. Offices are available for teaching and non-teaching staff.

Teaching facilities : Lecture theaters are used from common pool. They are provided with adequate A.V. Aids. There are 01 demonstration rooms with capacity of 60 seats each. The department participates in hospital work and the staff is posted to central clinical laboratory in rotation.

Teaching Programme: consists of lectures, demonstration, clinical postings and seminar. It is organized as per Council recommendations.

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Pharmacology Department:

Teaching staff consists of 01 Professor, 01 Associate Professor, 04 Assistant Professors and 04 Tutors. One Pharmaceutical chemist is also available. Offices are available for teaching and non-teaching staff.

Teaching facilities : Lecture theaters are used from common pool. They are provided with adequate A.V. Aids. There are 01 demonstration rooms with capacity of 60 seats each. A separate departmental museum is also provided. There are 1000 drug specimens, 96 photographs, 80 medicinal plants, 96 laminated charts and 60 graphs. Catalogues are available.
